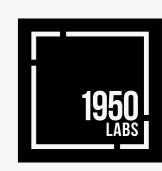

TYPE BEGINNERS TIPS



Avoid Mixing font families.

We will try to use a maximum of two fonts per project. Not all fonts are created equally, some work better for titles, others better for texts. Understanding at a glance if a font is more useful or not is something that requires a lot of experience and study. Our simplest recommendation is to look for documentation and notes from the authors about their possible uses, generally the fonts are designed for a purpose: printed, digital, titles, ornamental. Avoid horror vacui at all cost.

It is very tempting in design to cover the entire screen. Although it takes training to find the balance between good space and vacuum it would be a mistake to cover all visible areas. Good blog post here:

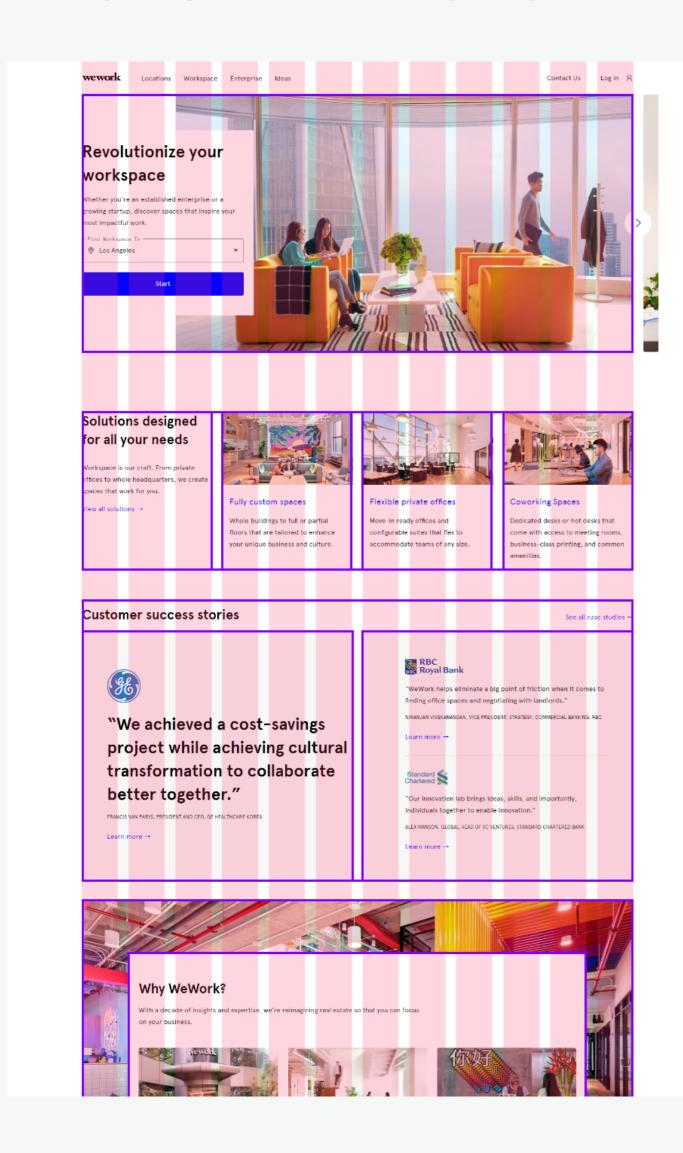

WE PRIORITIZE THE USE OF GRID

We design in a way that prioritizes the use of grid. That means that designing and programming using a 12 column grid helps simplify work and ensure better results. Do we always have to design and develop in columns? No, if there is a case in which it does not have to be used there is no problem. But if there is the possibility of applying a grid we will apply it

COLORS WE LIKE

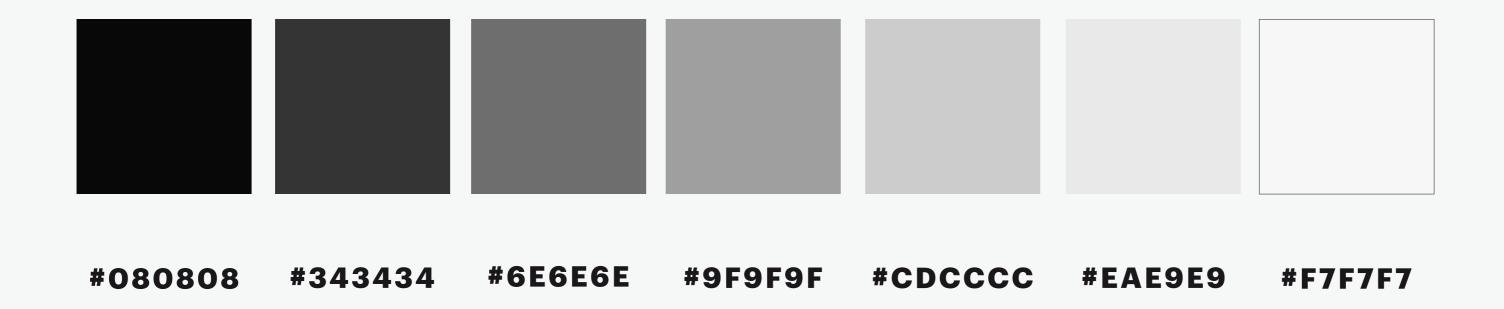
WE APPRECIATE THE USE OF WHITE, AND THE GOOD USE OF SPACE.
